FROM THE PASTOR:

Today is World Day of Prayer for Vocations. We celebrate it on this feast of the Good Shepherd because our Church needs people who will continue the ministry of Jesus, the Good Shepherd. I thought you would enjoy reading the following quote by Dom Helder Carara, the late Archbishop of Recife, Brazil, explaining how he felt about being a priest:



This a marvelous statement by a very good priest, one who befriended the poor as he served the Lord and His Church faithfully.

"I can't even imagine being anything but a priest. Just think, I consider the lack of imagination a crime and yet I haven't the imagination to see myself as not a priest. For me, being a priest isn't just a choice, it's a way of life. It's what water is for a fish, the sky for a bird. I really believe in Christ; Christ for me is not an abstract idea - he's a personal friend. Being a priest has never disappointed me nor given me regrets. Celibacy, chastity, the absence of a family in the way laymen understand it, all this has never been a burden to me. If I've missed certain joys, I've had and I have others so much more sublime. If you only knew what I feel when I say Mass, how I become one with it! The Mass for me is truly Calvary, and the Resurrection: it's a mad joy!

Look, there are those who are born to sing, those who are born to write, those who are born to play soccer, and those who are born to be priests. I was born to be a priest - I started saying so at the age of eight and certainly not because my parents had put the idea in my head. My father was a Mason and my mother went to church once a year.

I even remember that one day my father got frightened and said: "My son, you're always saying you want to be a priest. But you know what that means? A priest is someone who doesn't belong to himself, because he belongs to God and his people, someone who must dispense only love and faith and charity."

And I said, "I know. That's why I want to be a priest."

TUITION ASSISTANCE ENVELOPES

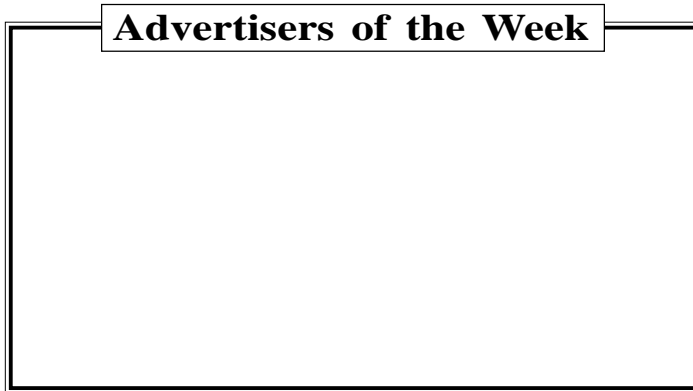

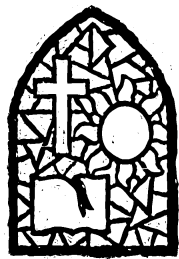

STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

If you are interested in donating one of the eighteen lower windows in the ambulatory of the nave of the church, the cost is \$7,000. These attractive stained glass windows enhance the beauty of the church, and it will be wonderful to have them all in place. We are establishing a stained glass window fund for smaller donations.

Also, we are now finalizing the design of the stained glass windows in our Blessed Sacrament Chapel. There will be a total of seven lower windows in stained glass with each depicting an angel at a cost of \$8,900 per window.

Eventually we will be placing stained glass in the upper windows of the nave; this is necessary to reduce glare. The windows in the great dome will not be done in stained glass but will remain as they are.
