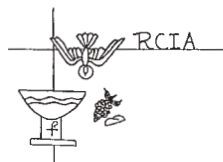
FROM THE PASTOR:

Having celebrated the great feast of Pentecost, bringing to a close the Easter season, we now enter ordinary time in the Church's liturgical year. Today is a most beautiful feast, mystery of the Godhead – three persons in One God, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This revealed truth is the central truth of the Faith, the basis of all that we believe.



Next Sunday is the Solemnity of the Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We will commission all parish Eucharistic Ministers, including those who take Holy Communion to the homebound, following the homily. Also, on this day we will have a Corpus Christi procession, as we did last year, following the 6:00 p.m. Life Teen Mass. The teens and all attending the Mass are invited to walk in this solemn procession which will begin after a period of silent adoration. We will process to the Life House, the cemetery and school building, with a brief prayer at each station. May we grow in our love for the Lord in the Eucharist.

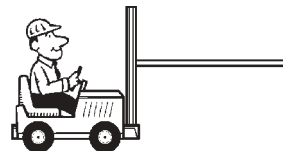
CHURCH ORGAN

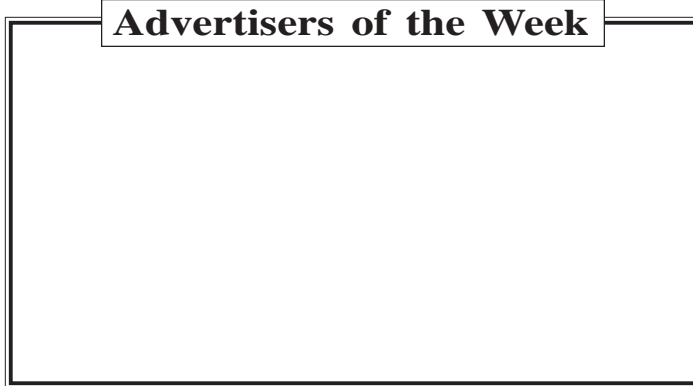

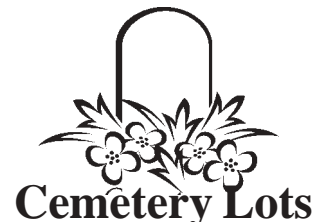
