FROM THE PASTOR:

On this feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord, we give some thought to some practical parts regarding our



participation at Mass and our reverence for the Blessed Sacrament.

1. When we enter the church to worship the Lord, we should bow toward the altar which symbolizes Christ. We genuflect when entering the Blessed Sacrament Chapel or whenever we are in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, for example, if we enter or leave the church during the consecration of the bread and wine and the distribution of Holy Communion.
2. Distractions should be kept to a minimum during Mass. No one should be seated during the proclamation of the Scripture readings (the responsorial psalm is an exception) or during the Eucharistic prayer. Wait until these are completed before taking a seat. If an infant starts to cry, it is best that the parent leaves the pew and walks the child in the gathering space, returning when the child has quieted down.
3. Arrive in time for Mass and stay for the entire Mass until the closing hymn. Leaving early sets a bad example for others.
4. In receiving Holy Communion, we should be properly disposed and in the state of grace. Communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted for an hour before the reception of Communion (no food, gum chewing, drinking of liquids other than water; however medicine is permitted), and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbor. Persons conscious of grave sin must first be reconciled with God and the Church through the Sacrament of Penance.
5. If the host is received in the hand, it should be placed on the palm. The person receiving in the hand should never take or "grab" the host from the Eucharistic Minister. The correct response is "Amen." A slight bow before receiving Holy Communion is appropriate. It is best to do this while the person in front of you is receiving Holy Communion.
6. Intinction, that is, dipping the host in the Precious Blood, is not permitted. If you choose to receive under both species, the accepted practice is drinking from the cup.
7. We welcome to the Mass those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions of Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.
8. Those persons not receiving Holy Communion may come forward for a blessing, with arms crossed over the chest. Persons not receiving the Lord's Body and Blood can in their hearts make a good spiritual communion.

PETER'S PENCE COLLECTION

Next week our parish will participate in the Peter's Pence Collection for the Works of the Holy Father. This collection enables the Holy Father to respond to requests for emergency funds from the most disadvantaged throughout the world. This special appeal is an opportunity to demonstrate justice and kindness to our brothers and sisters in need. Please pray for the Holy Father's works and contribute generously to the appeal.

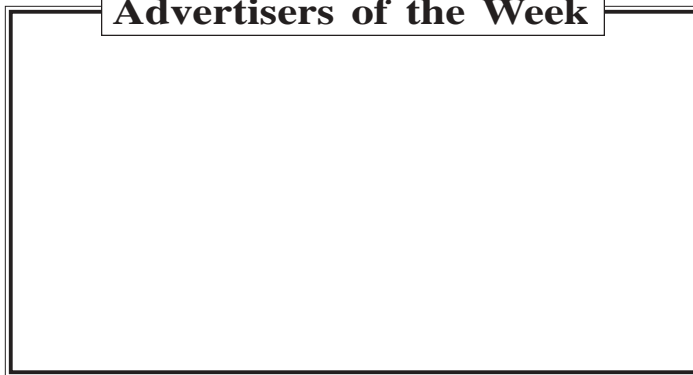
