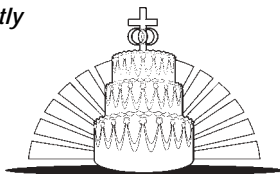

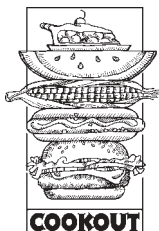


WEDDING POLICY

Weddings in the parish should be scheduled at least six months in advance of the wedding day. This will allow us to do the necessary preparation as required by the diocese. Also, active membership in the parish is required for at least six months prior to setting a date for the wedding. The wedding date may be set only by contacting one of the parish priests.

ANNUAL MISSION APPEAL

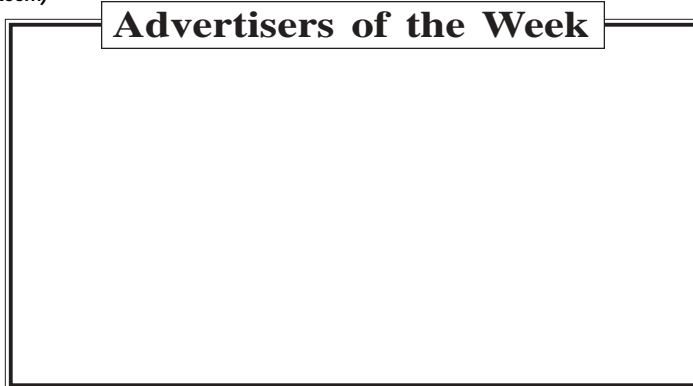

SUMMER MASS ATTIRE

How should one dress for Sunday Mass? With the warmer weather upon us, it is good to give thought to this question. Certainly we should dress appropriately. Let your Sunday attire reflect your respect for both the Eucharist and your fellow Christians with whom you worship the Lord. This is no ordinary social gathering. This is our sacred weekly gathering where as Christians we celebrate the Lord's death and resurrection. It is not appropriate to wear clothes you would wear, let's say, at a picnic or a backyard barbecue. And we should always dress modestly. Of course, the Sunday Mass should never turn into a kind of fashion parade where we draw attention to ourselves. Nor should it be a "come as you are" get-together where we make no effort to dress up, or at least to put on something nice. Because circumstances may prevent a person from wearing appropriate clothing at a Mass, e.g., persons going to or coming from work, we want to avoid standing in judgment of someone whose attire in our opinion is not appropriate. God, of course, sees into the heart and knows the worshiper's true disposition. But in society, clothes do make a difference, and we should keep this in mind when we attend Sunday Mass, which includes the Saturday evening celebration of the Lord's Supper.

LIFE TEEN REFLECTION

The mission of Life Teen, and therefore my mission as Youth Director, is to "Lead teens closer to Christ." What a joyous job description. But as all disciples of Christ know, it isn't always easy to live the Gospel. Several times this summer I have had to address individuals for being immodestly dressed. I prayed that they understood that I did so out of genuine love. Unfortunately, many of today's styles go against what the church defines as modest. As Catholics, we are to stand firm in the Truth amidst a world that says otherwise. Without going into specifics, because the same outfit can be fine on one person, but completely inappropriate for someone with different body build, I offer these guidelines. Tops that show as much skin as many swimsuits are inappropriate for Mass. Skirt and skort lengths should also be modest for Mass. But modesty is a virtue that should be practiced wherever we are. A good question to ask ourselves is: "Is what I'm wearing likely to lead other people into sinful thoughts about me?" Or, "Could I be inviting others to view me as an object rather than a child of God?" If there is any uncertainty, please change. I also encourage fashion-conscience females to ask someone who has high standards and who will be honest with you if an outfit is modest. Please pray for the courage to gently help each other to dress modestly. Our teens who attended Notre Dame Leadership Camp have pages of notes on the "Theology of the Body" and I'm sure they would be thrilled to share with everyone on this and other topics. Cindy

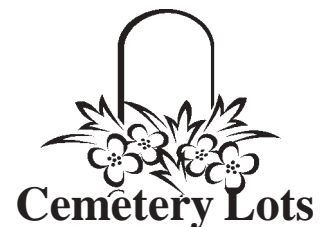
"The Spiritual Roots of Small Church Communities"

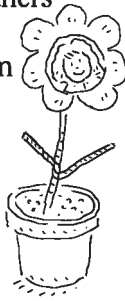

Make a
photo Flower
for someone you love

You will need:

- ✿ colored construction paper
- ✿ 2 green pipe cleaners
- ✿ small flower pot
- ✿ green florist foam (to fit in pot)
- ✿ scissors
- ✿ tape
- ✿ glue
- ✿ a photo of you!



How to make it:

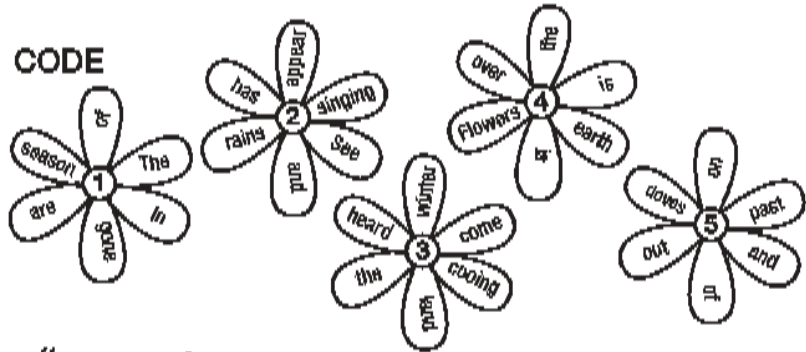
- ✿ Cut out your face from the photo. Make it a circle about 1-1/2" round.
- ✿ Fold a piece of colored paper in half and cut out 2 flower shapes.
- ✿ Glue your round photo in the center of one flower.
- ✿ Make a stem by folding a pipe cleaner in half and twisting it to make it stronger.
- ✿ Glue or tape the "stem" to the back of the flower that has your picture.
- ✿ Glue the other flower to the back of the first one. Make sure the "stem" is in between and sticks out from the bottom.
- ✿ Cut the other pipe cleaner in half to make leaves and then attach them to the "stem."
- ✿ Put the green foam in the pot.
- ✿ Plant your flower in the foam.
