### WORLD WAR II MEMORIAL DEDICATION

On Sunday, November 2nd, All Soul's Day, after the 11:00 a.m. Mass, we will be re-dedicating the World War II Memorial that has now been re-installed on the east side of our new church. Three members of the parish died in that war, and 37 others served in the military, from among the 250 families. Their names were inscribed on a bronze plaque that was installed in front of the old rectory on Auburn Road, and then moved across the street when the 1968 church was built, as part of an Eagle project for the St. Vincent Boy Scouts and Mike Crick. With the new school construction, the memorial has been moved once again, and re-furnished by the Boy Scouts here at St. Vincent.

You are invited to join the parish community and family members for this re-dedication. Any current member of the parish who served in that war, or had close relatives who served, are invited to display letters, pictures, military awards, or other memorabilia, that weekend, in the Gathering Space as we remember those who served our country, and the world, by stopping the spread of evil. Deliver your items to the box by the church office prior to the weekend if possible so we can prepare the displays. Then join us for the ceremony after the Mass, and stay for a short reception in the Gathering Space immediately after the dedication and blessing. 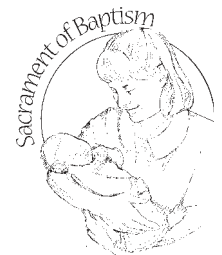
