CANCER SERVICES OF ALLEN COUNTY NEEDS VOLUNTEERS

It is not unusual in the course of medical care for a cancer survivor to need transportation to and from his or her treatment. Sometimes family members have stretched their resources and availability to the breaking point. Providing a responsible and caring volunteer to drive a cancer survivor to and from his or her radiation or chemotherapy appointments is one way we can alleviate the stress of the disease.

But, lately we have found that our pool of volunteers is too small in number and can't keep pace with the need. That's where you may be able to help...

WE NEED VOLUNTEER DRIVERS willing to use their own vehicle to pick up a cancer survivor and take him or her to treatment. Generally these appointments occur between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. and are scheduled several days in advance. You may wait for your client or return later to transport home.

HOSPITALIZED? WANT A PRIEST TO VISIT?

If you or a loved one is admitted to one of the local hospitals and would appreciate a visit from one of the priests and/or parish nurse, it is good to let us know, particularly if a person is admitted on an emergency basis. With the new privacy laws affecting hospitals and other health care institutions, we do not always receive the name of parishioners in the hospitals. Parishioners are admitted and even give the name of the church, but we are not notified; nor will the hospitals give us the name of the patient if we call inquiring as to whether or not a parishioner has been admitted. You may call the church office during the day and leave the name and room number of the parishioner who has been admitted.

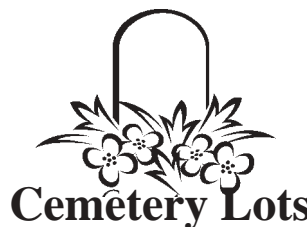
