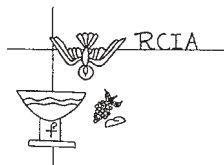

RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE AT ST. VINCENT'S

There will be an American Red Cross Blood Drive here at St. Vincent's on Saturday, May 22, 2004 in the Parish Hall (old gym). Donation hours are from 7:30 to 11:30 a.m.

Giving blood is safe, easy and extremely important! If you are at least 17 years old, weigh a minimum of 110 pounds, and you are in good general health, you are most likely eligible to donate blood.



It is recommended that you eat a light meal before you donate and drink plenty of fluids before and after. This will help those that feel light-headed after donating. If you've been deferred due to low iron, taking a multi-vitamin for a few days prior to the blood drive will ensure that you will be able to donate.

Blood donation takes less than one hour...the actual blood collection takes only 8-10 minutes. Walk-ins are welcome, but appointments will have priority. Also, childcare will be provided to make donating more convenient.

We have all been touched by someone who has needed blood or a blood product due to an illness or an injury. Cancer patients especially often need the life-saving benefit of blood. My own brother-in-law, who was recently diagnosed with cancer,

was given five units of blood while hospitalized. We are eternally grateful to those donors for truly saving his life. You too can help someone in his or her time of need. Please help by donating this life-giving gift of blood!

HEALTH FACTS – STROKE

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke. Now doctors say any bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

- *ask the individual to smile
- *ask him or her to raise both arms
- *ask the person to speak a simple sentence

If he or she has trouble with any of these tasks, call 9-1-1 immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher. Widespread use of this test could result in prompt diagnosis and treatment of the stroke and prevent brain damage. Courtesy of the Holistic Health Ministry
