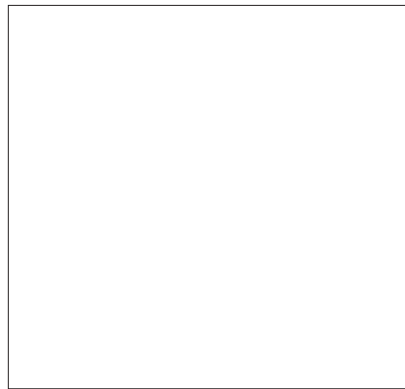

FROM THE PASTOR:

On this feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, may we renew our love for the Mass and our devotion to the Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament. May the following guidelines be of help:

1. When we enter or leave the nave of the church, we bow to the altar which represents Christ. Upon entering and leaving the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, we genuflect.
2. Distractions should be kept to a minimum during Mass. The ushers should avoid seating anyone during the Scripture readings (with the exception of the responsorial psalm) and the homily. Movement should be avoided during the entire Eucharistic Prayer.
3. Arrive on time for Mass and stay for the entire Mass until the closing hymn. Leaving Mass during or after the distribution of Holy Communion, unless one has a very good reason, should be avoided.
4. In receiving Holy Communion, a person should be properly disposed. Communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted for an hour before the reception of Communion (no food, gum chewing, drinking of liquids other than water; however, medicine is permitted), and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbor.
5. If the host is received in the hand, it should be placed on the palm. Prior to receiving the consecrated host or drinking from the cup, the communicant should bow.
6. Intinction, that is, dipping the host in the Precious Blood, is not permitted. The accepted practice is drinking from the cup.
7. We welcome to the Mass those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions of Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

SUMMER MASS ATTIRE

How should one dress for Sunday Mass? With the warmer weather upon us, it is good to give thought to this question. Certainly we should dress appropriately. Let your Sunday attire reflect your respect for both the Eucharist and your fellow Christians with whom you worship the Lord. This is no ordinary social gathering. This is our sacred weekly gathering where as Christians we celebrate the Lord's death and resurrection. It is not appropriate to wear clothes you would wear, let's say, at a picnic or a backyard barbecue. And we should always dress modestly. Of course, the Sunday Mass should never turn into a kind of fashion parade where we draw attention to ourselves. Nor should it be a "come as you are" get-together where we make no effort to dress up, or at least to put on something nice. Because circumstances may prevent a person from wearing appropriate clothing at a Mass, e.g., persons going to or coming from work, we want to avoid standing in judgment of someone whose attire in our opinion is not appropriate. God, of course, sees into the heart and knows the worshiper's true disposition. But in society, clothes do make a difference, and we should keep this in mind when we attend Sunday Mass, which includes the Saturday evening celebration of the Lord's Supper.

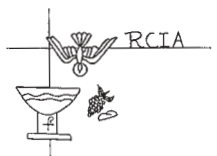
HARVEST HOUSE LUNCH & TOUR SCHEDULED

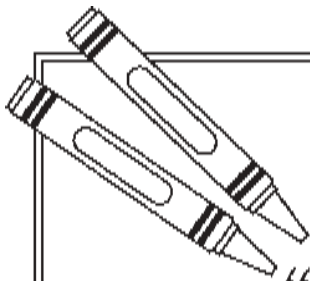

Play this acting game with your friends or in Sunday school class.

How to play:

1. Before you begin, agree on how many points are needed to win.
2. Choose a person from the Bible. Don't say who it is.
3. Without talking, act out something that your person did.
4. To discover who you are, the other players each ask you one question that can be answered “Yes” or “No.”
5. The first person to guess the right answer gets 1 point. If no one gets it right, you get 1 point.



6. Take turns acting out parts until someone wins.
