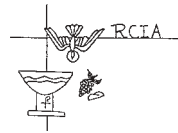

SUMMER MASS ATTIRE

How should one dress for Sunday Mass? With the warmer weather upon us, it is good to give thought to this question. Certainly we should dress appropriately. Let your Sunday attire reflect your respect for both the Eucharist and your fellow Christians with whom you worship the Lord. This is no ordinary social gathering. This is our sacred weekly gathering where as Christians we celebrate the Lord's death and resurrection. It is not appropriate to wear clothes you would wear, let's say, at a picnic or a backyard barbecue. And we should always dress modestly. Of course, the Sunday Mass should never turn into a kind of fashion parade where we draw attention to ourselves. Nor should it be a "come as you are" get-together where we make no effort to dress up, or at least to put on something nice. Because circumstances may prevent a person from wearing appropriate clothing at a Mass, e.g., persons going to or coming from work, we want to avoid standing in judgment of someone whose attire in our opinion is not appropriate. God, of course, sees into the heart and knows the worshiper's true disposition. But in society, clothes do make a difference, and we should keep this in mind when we attend Sunday Mass, which includes the Saturday evening celebration of the Lord's Supper.

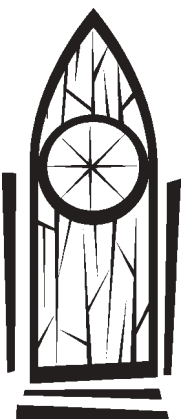
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION FOR FALL

STAINED GLASS WINDOWS TO FEATURE SAINTS

Having completed the lower and upper stained glass windows in the church, we are planning to install stained glass windows in the church alcoves. These will be figures of saints. We have definitely decided on St. Therese of Lisieux (Little Flower), one of the most popular saints of modern times. Our parish was founded by French immigrants, and there is some speculation that one of Therese's relatives is buried in our old parish cemetery. The window with the figure of St. Therese has a donor. The two side windows in the same alcove will cost \$3,655 each. These stained glass windows will include roses complementing the window with the figure of St. Therese. 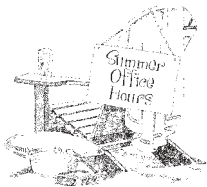

I know a father who remembers the last time his youngest child would accept a kiss on her way to school.

I know a father who raised another man's child as his own and made sure she never felt the lack of a father.

I know a father who is called a "stepfather" and says it means to "step in" when and where he is needed.

I know a father who is called a "father-in-law" and who loves his "children-in-law" as much as his own.

I know a father who says "I love you" by taking photographs and there they are - the bright shining faces of everyone except the father-photographer.

I know a father whose son is in trouble and who brought uncomfortable attention to his family and yet this father continues to love and support his son, praying for him every day.

I know a father who prayed in the traditional way, but it didn't seem enough so he decided to give up beer until his hurting son was doing better. A funny-kind-of-prayer not mentioned in any of the liturgical books, but as sincere a prayer as ever was prayed.

I know a man who longed for children of his own and when they didn't come, he fathered all the children who called him "coach" and "teacher" and "friend."
