The Legacy of Faith campaign is different from the Annual Bishop's Appeal in that this one-time historic effort will assist in providing financial solvency for the Diocese for years to come. Gifts to the campaign will be put into endowments that will allow our Church to better provide its ministries in the near future and for future generations.

We are pleased to announce that our Legacy of Faith campaign has reached a total of \$1,101,279.60 in pledges from a total of 103 gifts. This total represents 46% of our overall target. We are grateful for an excellent start to our Legacy of Faith campaign.

Lastly, we are pleased to report that approximately 75 of your fellow parishioners have said "YES" to the call of the Legacy of Faith campaign and will be assisting us for the next few weeks. 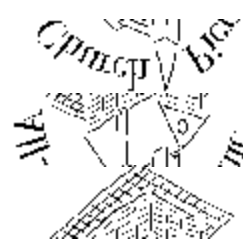

It is recommended that you eat a light meal before you donate and drink plenty of fluids before and after. This will help those that feel light-headed after donating. If you've been deferred due to low iron, taking a multi-vitamin for a few days prior to the blood drive will ensure that you will be able to donate.

Blood donation takes less than one hour...the actual blood collection takes only 8-10 minutes. Walk-ins are welcome, but appointments will have priority. Also, childcare will be provided to make donating more convenient.

We have all been touched by someone who has needed blood or a blood product due to an illness or an injury. Take this opportunity to help someone in their time of need. Please help by donating this life-giving gift of blood!
