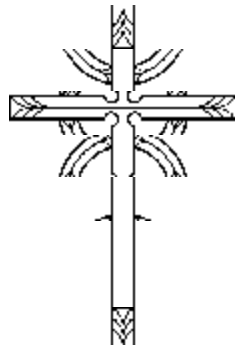

There will be an American Red Cross Blood Drive here at St. Vincent's on Saturday, October 2, 2004, in the Parish Hall (old gym). Donation hours are from 7:30 to 11:30 a.m.

Giving blood is safe, easy and extremely important! If you are at least 17 years old, weigh a minimum of 110 pounds, and you are in good general health, you are most likely eligible to donate blood. It is recommended that you eat a light meal before you donate and drink plenty of fluids before and after. This will help those that feel light-headed after donating. If you've been deferred due to low iron, taking a multi-vitamin for a few days prior to the blood drive will ensure that you will be able to donate.

Blood donation takes less than one hour...the actual blood collection takes only 8-10 minutes. Walk-ins are welcome, but appointments will have priority. Also, childcare will be provided to make donating more convenient.

We have all been touched by someone who has needed blood or a blood product due to an illness or an injury. Take this opportunity to help someone in their time of need. Please help by donating this life-giving gift of blood!

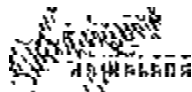

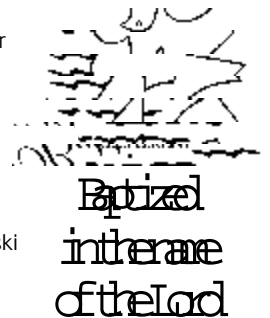

## CHANGES NECESSARY FOR LIFE TEEN MASS

The LIFE TEEN Mass began at St. Vincent's about 9 years ago. The mission of LIFE TEEN is to lead teens closer to Christ. This youth movement, which is centered on the Eucharist, meets teens where they are while challenging them to lead holy lives. The LIFE TEEN Mass is geared specifically toward teens, although many families and older parishioners find it uplifting and encouraging. While at Notre Dame Leadership Camp this summer LIFE TEEN founder, Monsignor Dale Fushek

informed us that some of the ways we draw teens into the liturgy will change. In a letter to all LIFE TEEN parishes he writes: "On June 4, the Bishop of Phoenix, Most Rev. Thomas J. Olmsted, met in Rome with Francis Cardinal Arinze regarding LIFE TEEN. His Eminence Cardinal Arinze, Prefect of the Congregation of Divine Worship, stated his support for LIFE TEEN and said he was "heartened to see that dedicated persons have taken initiative to promote the liturgy especially since, in various parts of the world, a disaffection for the Mass is found among young people". The Cardinal was very supportive of LIFE TEEN and encouraged our mission to continue. However, he also believed that LIFE TEEN needs to fully implement the new General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)."

There are two changes that St. Vincent's LIFE TEEN will make:

In accordance with the new GIRM, teens will no longer enter the sanctuary for the Eucharistic prayer. Being in the sanctuary is reserved for the priest celebrant, concelebrants, and those performing a specific ministry.

The GIRM very specifically offers three options for the end of the Mass. We will no longer use the phrase "The Mass never ends, it must be lived, so let's go forth to love and serve the Lord" and begin using one of the three prescribed endings found in the Missal.

These changes will be implemented over the next 3 weeks. One week we will announce the changes, the next Fr. Mark will catechize about the changes, and the third week we will make the changes with joyful obedience. High School teens will be invited to come forward, but will not stand or kneel around the altar which is the sanctuary. We trust that our teens will continue to grow closer to Christ through powerful teen relevant homilies, quality worshipful music and most of all through the Eucharist. As we, with Monsignor Dale, look forward, "the commitment of LIFE TEEN to evangelize our youth and to call them to Christ is stronger than ever. We will work for vocations. Our Holy Father John Paul II remains our role model. Our Blessed Mother remains our patron."

## HAUNTED CASTLE

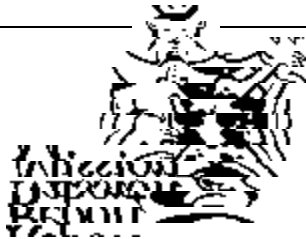
