## Legacy of Faith

We are pleased to announce to you that our Legacy of Faith campaign has reached a total of \$2,116,096.60 in pledges from a total of 345 gifts. This total represents 88% of our overall target. We thank you all for your generosity and time. As mentioned before, our remaining parish families will be contacted in the coming weeks, and we thank you in advance for listening to the presentation our volunteers are personally presenting to you. There is a good amount of information to digest, and we are confident that you will find their assistance in answering your questions very helpful. At this time we would like to spend a few moments discussing another important need that the Legacy of Faith campaign will address – Priest Retirement.

We are blessed in our Diocese with more than 62 active diocesan priests and 33 religious order priests, men who serve selflessly in so many ways as they administer the sacraments. They celebrate Mass, hear confessions, baptize us, counsel us, and comfort us in times of need. They have been teachers, builders, and friends, contributing immeasurably to the lives of individuals and the greater Church.

Catholics of the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend have willingly accepted the responsibility to help provide financial support for our priests in their retirement years, and since 1976 the Diocese has provided them with a modest pension, supplemented by Social Security and medical insurance.

It is essential that we continue to provide financial stability for our currently retired priests, and guarantee future security for active priests by growing our current fund. In an increasingly complex world, security is also important in attracting future priests to the Church. Through a \$1 million allocation from the Legacy of Faith campaign, we will fully finance the priest pension fund, and provide the capability for expanded coverage in the years ahead.

Again, we are thankful for the generosity shown by the families who are helping to make this campaign a reality with their generous gifts of time, talent and treasure.
