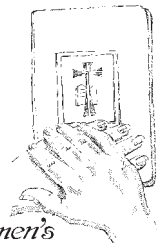

**PRESENTATION OF GIFTS**

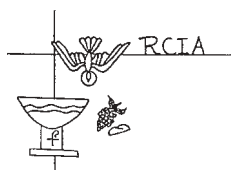

# GOOD NEWS

## Trinity Sunday

Ex 34:4b-6, 8-9 / 2 Cor 13:11-13 / Jn 3:16-18

I came across this bit of wisdom in a novel: "The real challenge in a changing world is not to recognize the outmoded, but to preserve that which remains valid" (*The New Girls* by Beth Gutcheon).

The desire to throw out the old and embrace the new is not unique to any culture or generation. The difference today is that the new become old so fast—certainly in less than a generation.

I remember a bride I interviewed fifteen years ago. We were talking about the music at her wedding and she said she just wanted "traditional music." Fortunately, I had the presence of mind to ask her what she thought of as "traditional."

"Oh, you know," she replied, "like *Glory and Praise to Our God* and *One Bread, One Body*."

As the composers of these songs were my friends and I had sung on the album that introduced their music to the public, I suddenly felt old. Make that ancient. (By the way, "albums" were like big CDs and you could play both sides.)

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Is the Trinity an outmoded idea? Arius thought so. He was a fourth century theologian who denied the divinity of Christ and therefore the idea of the Trinity. He was also a talented musician and wrote clever songs with lyrics that proclaimed "*There was a time when the Son was not.*" This may not sound too catchy to the modern age, but thousands of Christians began to sing these songs and Saint Athanasius and Saint John Chrysostom wrote other hymns to counter the effect of Arius' heretical proclamations.

In today's liturgy we proclaim that Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are three persons in one Godhead. It's a difficult idea to grasp and great minds have wrestled with this doctrine, but the doctrine is preserved in how we pray at every liturgy. Our prayer is always offered to the Father, through the Son, and in the Holy Spirit, or in other words, it is God within us (Spirit) talking through God (the Son) to God (the Father/Creator).
