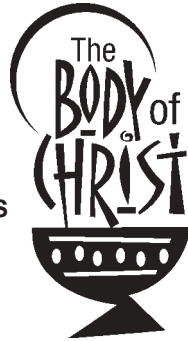

FROM THE PASTOR:

On this Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, may we renew our love for the Mass and our devotion to the Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament. May the following guidelines be of help:

1. When we enter or leave the nave of the church, we bow to the altar which represents Christ. Upon entering and leaving the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, we genuflect.
2. Arrive on time for Mass and stay for the entire Mass until the closing hymn. Leaving Mass during or after the distribution of Holy Communion, unless one has a very good reason, should be avoided.
3. In receiving Holy Communion, a person should be properly disposed. Communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted for an hour before the reception of Communion (no food, gum chewing, drinking of liquids other than water; however, medicine is permitted), and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbor.
4. If the host is received in the hand, it should be placed on the palm. Prior to receiving the consecrated host or drinking from the cup, the communicant should bow.
5. Intinction, that is, dipping the host in the Precious Blood, is not permitted. The accepted practice is drinking from the cup.
6. We welcome to the Mass those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions of Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

SUMMER MASS ATTIRE

How should one dress for Sunday Mass? With the warmer weather upon us, it is good to give thought to this question. Certainly we should dress appropriately. Let your Sunday attire reflect your respect for both the Eucharist and your fellow Christians with whom you worship the Lord. This is no ordinary social gathering. This is our sacred weekly gathering where as Christians we celebrate the Lord's death and resurrection. It is not appropriate to wear clothes you would wear, let's say, at a picnic or a backyard barbecue. And we should always dress modestly. Of course, the Sunday Mass should never turn into a kind of fashion parade where we draw attention to ourselves. Nor should it be a "come as you are" get-together where we make no effort to dress up, or at least to put on something nice. Because circumstances may prevent a person from wearing appropriate clothing at a Mass, e.g., persons going to or coming from work, we want to avoid standing in judgment of someone whose attire in our opinion is not appropriate. God, of course, sees into the heart and knows the worshiper's true disposition. But in society, clothes do make a difference, and we should keep this in mind when we attend Mass.

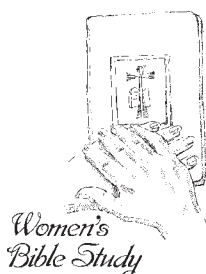


NOW IT'S YOUR TURN

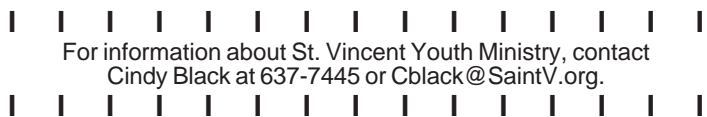

WHAT'S COOKING?

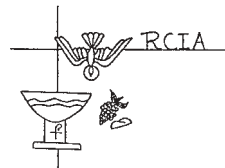

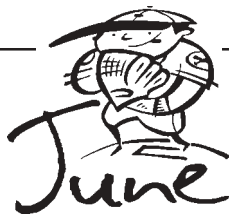

When we adopted our sons, they were still citizens of Guatemala. We then went through the naturalization ceremony to make them citizens of the United States. Our oldest son, Daniel, was the last to arrive. He came to us at age ten, and we let him wait until he could speak for himself to become an American citizen.

The immigration officer met with us for the initial interview. Everything was going along fine until she came to the question, "In the event of war, will you bear arms for the United States?"

Daniel looked confused. "What does 'bear arms' mean?"

She explained that it meant, "Would you fight for your country in the military?"

There was a long silence as Daniel pondered. Then he turned to me, "Would I have to fight if the United States went to war with Guatemala? I don't know if I could kill one of my own people."

How does a mother answer a question like that? I panicked as I pictured Daniel without a country. Then the officer rescued us and explained about alternative service which doesn't involve fighting and Daniel agreed that he could do that.

This weekend we celebrate both Corpus Christi and Memorial Day. The concurrence of these two special days brought to mind Daniel's concern. Today we hear Saint Paul's words to the Corinthians: "There is one bread and we who are many are one body for we all partake of the one bread."

Christians everywhere in the world make up the One Body. Whatever their color, their language, their nationality - even if they are living in a country declared to be my country's enemy - they and I are part of the One Body. Like my son, Daniel, I don't know if I could kill one of my own people.

And what of non-Christians? Our Father in heaven is theirs. Our Lord died for them, too.

What does a disciple of Jesus do when threatened? What law should apply? I have not been put to the test. I don't know the answer. I only know the questions.
