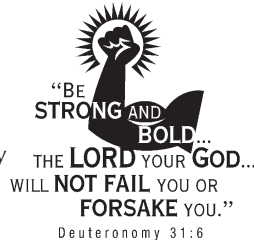

# GOOD NEWS

## Twentieth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Is 56:2,6-7 / Rom 11:13-15,29-32 / Mt 15:21-28

It seems there has always been "us" and "them." Cain and Abel. Jews and Gentiles. Believers and non-believers. Citizens and immigrants. Today's readings confront this issue head-on and the message is both challenging and comforting.

Isaiah is addressing the problem of so many foreigners moving to Jerusalem. Through the prophet, the Lord says that if the foreigners keep the Sabbath and hold to the covenant, then they are welcome. Try to imagine the outrage of the Chosen People as they listened to the prophet's words.

In the gospel Jesus is confronted with a woman begging for healing for her daughter. The woman is described as a Canaanite - a daughter of Cain who killed his brother, Abel, and was cast out. A Gentile.

Jesus ignores her! The disciples ask him to dismiss her - meaning, "give her what she wants so she'll leave us in peace." Jesus' reply sounds callous to our ears: "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." The woman continues to petition Jesus and cries, "Lord, help me." Jesus then calls her a dog! The woman counters, "Even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table."

This exchange seems harsh, but scripture scholars explain that this kind of banter was common in first century Palestine and Jesus would have enjoyed it. Apparently he did enjoy it so much that he grants her request and praises her faith. In this encounter, Jesus both welcomes the foreigner and, by referring to them as "lost sheep," chides the first people of the covenant for forgetting God's special place in their lives.

Saint Paul, who describes his ministry as "the apostle to the Gentiles," agonizes that his own people reject Jesus as the Messiah. In a complex botanical metaphor (Romans 11:17-24) he warns the Christians that they could just as easily become proud and reject the blessing of their new-found faith.

Yesterday's enthusiastic converted believer can become today's self-satisfied, mainstream, status-quo "member." The message of today's readings is both a comfort and a challenge: to God there is no "them" - only "us."
