FROM THE PASTOR

As we follow the liturgical calendar of the Church, the feast of St. Vincent de Paul is celebrated on September 27. Because this is our patronal feast, Church law allows us to move the celebration to the closest Sunday. Today, at all the Masses, we are honoring this great saint who devoted his life to serving the poor.

Blessed Frederic Ozanam, who lived from 1813-1853, was so inspired by the life of St. Vincent de Paul that he founded the St. Vincent de Paul Society which is known throughout the world for its service to the poor. Our own St. Vincent de Paul Conference helps many families in need of assistance, and today we have our annual collection, immediately following the first collection, for its work with the poor.

The other day I paused to look at the beautiful mosaic of St. Vincent, located on the wall near our baptismal font. It shows him standing with his arms outstretched over an elderly woman and two children. A donor has come forth for a stained glass window of Pope John Paul II which will be in one of our alcoves. We have one remaining alcove without a stained glass window. It would be very nice to have a stained glass window honoring Blessed Ozanam, a married man and lawyer.

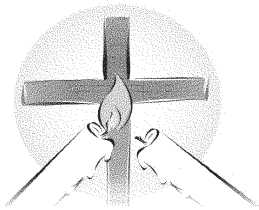

Every day in the United States, 4,400 children are killed by surgical abortion. If the chemical abortions are included, it is estimated that up to 35,000 pre-born boys and girls are murdered each day nationally.

On Sunday, October 2, the March for Life Committee will hold its 13th annual Memorial Service commemorating the death of the 643 babies killed by abortion in Fort Wayne this past year. These are the little boys and girls killed each Thursday at the Women’s Health Organization located at 827 Webster Street. RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE AT ST. VINCENT'S

Every two seconds, someone in America needs blood. In fact, there's a 97% chance that someone you know will require a blood transfusion in his or her lifetime. What greater gift can you give than the gift of life?

At this time there is a great need for all types of blood due to the recent hurricane, which destroyed many blood centers in the gulf coast area. They are counting on us to supply them with the blood they so desperately need.

Please help by donating this life-giving gift of blood at the American Red Cross Blood Drive here at St. Vincent's on Saturday, October 1, 2005, in the Parish Hall (old gym). Donation hours are from 7:30 to 11:30 a.m.

Giving blood is safe, easy and extremely important! If you are at least 17 years old, weigh a minimum of 110 pounds, and you are in good general health, you are most likely eligible to donate blood. It is recommended that you eat a light meal before you donate and drink plenty of fluids before and after. This will help those that feel light-headed after donating. If you've been deferred due to low iron, taking a multi-vitamin for a few days prior to the blood drive will ensure that you will be able to donate. Blood donation takes less than one hour - the actual blood collection takes only 8-10 minutes. Walk-ins are welcome, but appointments will have priority. Also, childcare will be provided to make donating more convenient.
