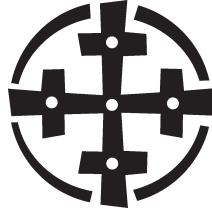

There's something weird in today's gospel.

It's the Sabbath day and Jesus goes to the synagogue. The custom is to invite a visitor to read the Scriptures and to offer commentary on those Scriptures and so it is with Jesus. So far so good.

The people are astonished at his teaching. Also pretty normal. Here's the weird part. Who is the first to recognize Jesus? Who believes his teaching? Who knows him? It's the unclean spirit, the demon in the possessed man. He cries out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are - the Holy One of God!"

Jesus rebukes the demon, casting him out.

There are two misconceptions about evil. One is that there is no such thing, that the idea of evil is old-fashioned and we don't really need to pay attention to temptation or sin. What does it matter if we lie a little, cheat a little, sound off when we're offended, take more than our share, avoid our duties, eat or drink too much, skip church, forget to pray? We're not bad people, are we?

The saints and wise ones of our tradition know that sin creeps in, beginning with slight self-indulgence and before we take notice, it has taken over and "possesses us." It's like "suddenly" finding ourselves fifty pounds overweight. It starts with one pound.

The other misconception is that evil is more powerful than good. We read of the terrible things people do to each other - of genocide, of random and senseless violence, of the abuse of little children - and we despair and forget what the demons knew when they saw Jesus. "Have you come to destroy us?" they asked. The answer is, "Yes."

"If today you hear God's voice, harden not your heart," sings the psalmist. We avoid evil and do good by attending to God's voice today. What are we called to today? It may not be a great thing, but small things done with a humble heart and willing hands are the seeds of great holiness.
