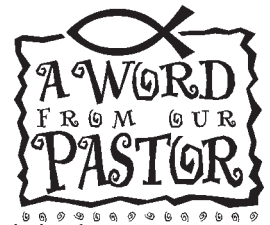


PARISH WIDE MISSION TRIP

FROM THE PASTOR

Three weeks ago, I preached on Stewardship of Treasure, asking you to give prayerful thought to the portion of your income you want to give to your parish and to indicate this by making a pledge. Your pledge, which is based on the biblical tithe, clearly demonstrates that you take your Catholic faith seriously. Thank you for returning your stewardship of treasure pledge form.



Today, at all the Masses, I am addressing Stewardship of Time and Talent. We are all accountable to God on how we use our God-given talents in the service of the community. We can choose to be selfish with our talents and time, or we can choose to be self-giving in imitation of our Savior.

The service we give need not be confined to our parish community. Many of our parishioners reach out to the Fort Wayne community through involvement in agencies or organizations that serve the people of this community, particularly the needy.

Our Small Christian Communities have proven to be a good venue for exercising one's stewardship of time and talent. We would like to see these communities flourish.

Our parish, with approximately 3,000 households, is large; involvement in the life of the parish gives a parishioner a sense of ownership and more of a family feeling. You are urged today to give prayerful thought to how you can better use the gifts God has given you. Everyone has something to offer.

Next week, we will publish in the bulletin a synopsis of the results of the parish survey which was conducted several months ago. Bishop D'Arcy has received a copy of the final report.

RE-MEMBERING CHURCH

The Precepts of the Church—basic norms for active Catholics. The Precepts of the Church are derived from Catholicism's moral and doctrinal foundations and are notable in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (nos. 2041-2043). Catholics should consult the Precepts of the Church as a sort of "self-assessment" by which their compliance with the **minimum** criteria (a short list of must do things) for active Church membership can be measured. But if we look at these as must do rather than want to do, perhaps our faith life needs some further examination.

The Precepts of the Church

1. Attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation.
2. Confess your sins at least once a year.
3. Humbly participate in the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
4. Keep holy the holy days of obligation.
5. Observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.

Also noted in this section of the Catechism is the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church.

Pray that the Holy Spirit will send a witness to touch the heart of inactive Catholics. Pray for the courage to be a witness that will encourage an inactive Catholic to come back to the church. 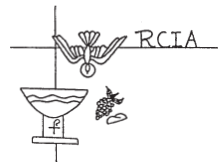
