RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

RE CLASSES TO BEGIN

Religious Ed classes are scheduled to begin on Wednesday, September 20, at 6:00 p.m. and on Sunday, September 24, at 4:00 p.m. Children who are enrolled in public schools or who do not receive formal Catholic training should be signed up to attend Religious Ed classes. The families of those who attend must be registered in the parish.

CAN YOU BE A CATECHIST?

If you are drawn to working with children, have a love for our Catholic faith, and are willing to share your love of God, you can be a catechist in the Religious Ed program. Many parents are calling daily to register their children. This means that we need catechists to instruct those who attend on Sundays and Wednesdays. At this time, we need one catechist on Wednesday, but we need several on Sunday for grades 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7. Your time investment is approximately 2-3 hours of preparation a week, along with teaching the 90 minute class. Bring a friend, older child, or spouse to assist you. RE REGISTRATION

All children entering grade 1 and new students to the program for grades 2-8 must be registered. Call 489-3537 ext. 235. Due to the size of the program the RE office will not place children in classes by request. Also, if your child is changing from Wednesday or Sunday, please notify the RE office. All children who attended last year will automatically be advanced to the next grade level for the same night they attended last year and do not need to re-register.

SACRAMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

The diocese requires that before children can make their First Communion (grade 2) and be confirmed (grade 8), they must be enrolled in the grade prior to those sacramental years. This means that children must complete grade one prior to First Communion and seventh grade prior to Confirmation.
