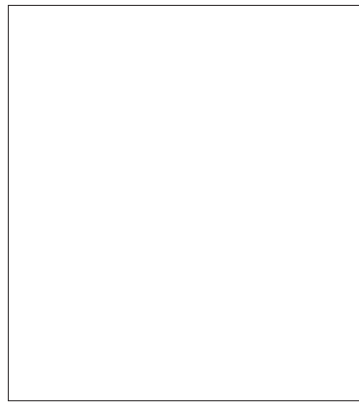

FROM THE PASTOR

You will find in this bulletin the parish's financial report for the 2005-06 fiscal year. The report was prepared by Sherry Miller, our Business Manager, and presented to the Finance Council for approval. I am grateful to Sherry Miller for so capably overseeing parish finances and for directing parish construction projects and other significant improvements on the property. I want to thank you for your stewardship of treasure. The parish is in good financial shape because of your generous financial support. I thank you from the bottom of my heart.



Some parishioners may withhold giving to the parish because they perceive the parish to be wealthy and not in need of their offertory gift. They may prefer to direct their gift elsewhere where they believe the need is greater. This, I believe, is contrary to the spirit of true stewardship. When it comes to sharing our money, our first obligation is to our parish community. It is within the parish that our faith is nourished and strengthened, and we support our parish out of gratitude to God. We give a percentage of our income (5%?) to the parish and then, as our resources permit, to others, such as charitable causes, diocesan appeals, Catholic school tuition. We remain committed to helping the poor through our Project Solidarity.

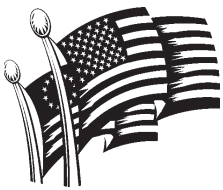
PLAYGROUND HELP NEEDED

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION CLASS

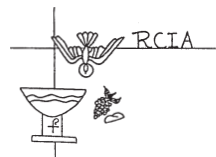
