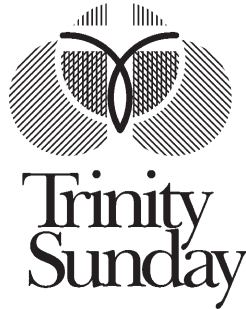

WE HAVE OPENINGS FOR VBS – REGISTRATION EXTENDED

LOOKING FOR A REPLACEMENT

It's been another great year for ABC's, Boxtops and Campbell's at St. Vincent's. We've collected nearly half a million dollars in Scott's receipts this year. To give you an idea of what that's worth, it would be enough to select two Dell Inspiron Notebook computers and two HP Photosmart Digital cameras for the school. Through Campbell's Labels for Education, with our last deposit, we will have nearly 43,000 points banked. If the school chooses, that would be enough to select one Casio Digital Electronic piano, or two Sony Cyber Shot cameras as an example. From Boxtops for Education this year, the school received two checks totaling nearly \$1,500. In our final deposit before the end of the month, we will also be banking over \$300 of boxtops for next year. We are also in the process of making our first Tyson Project A+ deposit of the year. We should receive between \$50 - \$100 for the school. Please continue saving and submitting the red 1, 2, 3 Project A+ strips from Tyson chicken products. You can continue to save proofs and turn them in over this summer in the church drop location in the Campbell Soup can inside the west church door. A few reminders: We don't save Progresso, Vandecamp or Chef Boyardee labels or Betty Crocker points. Campbell's doesn't accept front labels anymore. Correct proofs are the UPC (bar code) with the Campbell's kids attached to it. Prego acceptable proofs are the jar lids, not labels. A big thank you to Marlene Campbell for all her help with Scott's ABC's. As far as Scott's knows, the program will continue next school year. I'd also like to thank Debbie O'Shaughnessy for all the sorting and cutting she did. Finally, thanks to everyone over the last three years who saved and turned in proofs, cut them, or helped in any way. I regret that due to additional responsibilities I have taken on with St. Vincent Boy Scouts, I will have to pass on the coordination of these programs to someone else. Please don't let these programs die out. As you can see, they are very beneficial to our school. Contact me if you're able and willing to help. A Verse Frame

Make this special gift for your dad, uncle, grandfather or father-figure. It is nice to be reminded of our heavenly Father's love for us.

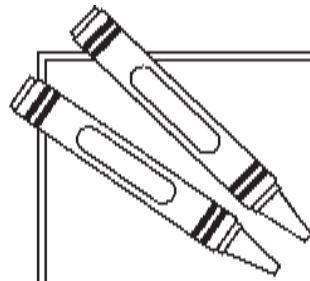
What you need:

- Piece of craft foam (8½" x 11", any color)
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Piece of paper (8½" x 11", any color)
- Pencil, crayons or marker
- Foam shapes, stickers (optional)
- Glue
- Hole punch
- Ribbon or yarn



What you do:

1. Use your ruler to measure a rectangle inside the piece of craft foam. Draw the rectangle, and then cut it out. Your foam should now look like a frame.
2. Place the piece of paper under the foam frame, and trace the shape of the frame's window onto the paper.
3. Choose a verse to write inside the rectangle on your paper. (Your frame can go horizontally or vertically.) Suggested verses include 1 Corinthians 8:6, Philippians 4:20 and 1 John 3:1.
4. Turn the frame over (face down), and put glue around the edge. Lay the verse face down on the back of the frame, and let it dry.
5. Decorate the outside of the frame with foam shapes, stickers or drawings.
6. Use your hole punch to punch two holes at the top of the frame. Tie a piece of ribbon or yarn through the holes to hang the frame.
