FROM THE PASTOR

On this Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, may we renew our love for the Mass and our devotion to the Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament. May the following guidelines be of help:

1. When we enter or leave the nave of the Church, we bow to the altar which represents Christ, unless the Blessed Sacrament is present on the altar; then we genuflect. Upon entering and leaving the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, we genuflect.
2. Arrive on time for Mass and stay for the entire Mass until the closing hymn. Leaving Mass during or after the distribution of Holy Communion, unless one has a very good reason, should be avoided.
3. In receiving Holy Communion, a person should be properly disposed. Communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted for an hour before the reception of Communion (no food, gum chewing, drinking of liquids other than water; however, medicine is permitted), and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbor.
4. If the host is received in the hand, it should be placed on the palm. Prior to receiving the consecrated host or drinking from the cup, the communicant should bow.
5. Intinction, that is, dipping the host in the Precious Blood, is to be avoided. The accepted practice is drinking from the cup.
6. We welcome to the Mass those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions of Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

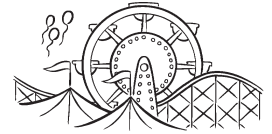

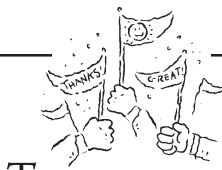

LOOKING FOR A REPLACEMENT

It's been another great year for ABC's, Boxtops and Campbell's at St. Vincent's. We've collected nearly half a million dollars in Scott's receipts this year. To give you an idea of what that's worth, it would be enough to select two Dell Inspiron Notebook computers and two HP Photosmart Digital cameras for the school. Through Campbell's Labels for Education, with our last deposit, we will have nearly 43,000 points banked. A big thank you to Marlene Campbell for all her help with Scott's ABC's. As far as Scott's knows, the program will continue next school year. I'd also like to thank Debbie O'Shaughnessy for all the sorting and cutting she did. Finally, thanks to everyone over the last three years who saved and turned in proofs, cut them, or helped in any way. I regret that due to additional responsibilities I have taken on with St. Vincent Boy Scouts, I will have to pass on the coordination of these programs to someone else. Please don't let these programs die out. As you can see, they are very beneficial to our school. Contact me if you're able and willing to help. GOOD NEWS

Body and Blood of Christ

Gn 14:18-20 / 1 Cor 11:23-26 / Lk 9:11b-17

Plain, humble food - that's how Jesus presents himself to us - in plain, humble food. I'm afraid to think this, much less to write it, but I wish I appreciated it more. I wish I were...hungry.

Every time I sit down to a meal, I give thanks. When I eat with my husband or with our whole family, we say grace while holding hands - a tradition that began when our first son was a baby. Holding hands reminded him to wait until after we prayed. Now his babies reach out their hands, impatient for the prayer. We all enjoy our granddaughter's hearty "Amen!"

I give thanks, but I don't know how grateful I am. I never feel that kind of hunger that makes you grateful for food. I enjoy food, family meals, some cooking - although my husband is the far better cook. I enjoy that much of our food comes from our garden, eggs from our chickens, milk from our goats. Just this afternoon I used the last of our basil ice cubes from last year's garden. (Put basil in a blender with a little olive oil, freeze in ice cube trays, pop out and store in freezer bags and, voila instant seasoning for pasta sauce and soups).

But I'd be more thankful if I were hungry.

I'm touched by the folks in our congregation who are hungry for Eucharist. There is one man, raised in another Christian denomination, who accompanies his wife to Mass and who admitted that he felt he was starving - for holy Communion! A woman who was divorced and remarried wept with longing for the Eucharist while she waited for her first marriage to be annulled.

I'm ashamed to admit it, but often I take food and Eucharist for granted.

Sometimes we sing our grace at meals; one song we learned in the Guatemalan orphanage where our sons began their lives. It's my prayer for all of us on this Corpus Christi:

Dear Lord, give bread to those who are hungry;
Hunger for thee to those who now have bread.
